**CHAIR OF THE TRUST BOARD – STATEMENT OF INTENT**

**(Authorised for use by the Chair 8 June 2016)**

The Trust has implemented a range of rules and policies which together make up the Trust's Constitution; over the coming years this Constitution will mature as it is used. During my tenure as the Chair of the Board, I intend to validate and continue to develop the Constitution to reflect the requirements of the Trust, its members, the developing guidance of the Supporters' Direct and of course, legal requirements.

The Constitution provides guidance on all aspects of the Trust's business and as such should be read and understood by all members. The Constitution must at all times support the Objects of the Trust which are stated in section 4 of the Trust's rules:

- Being the democratic and representative voice of the supporters of the Club and strengthening the bonds between the Club and the communities which it serves;
- Achieving the greatest possible supporter and community influence in the running and ownership of the Club;
- Promoting responsible and constructive community engagement by present and future members of the communities served by the Club and encouraging the Club to do the same;
- Operating democratically, fairly, sustainably, transparently and with financial responsibility and encouraging the Club to do the same;
- Being a positive, inclusive and representative organisation, open and accessible to all supporters of the Club regardless of their age, income, ethnicity, gender, disability, sexuality or religious or moral belief.

The Trust Constitution should assist not hinder the way in which the Trust carries out its business and as such any member of the Trust is encouraged to challenge the Constitution if its relevance, accuracy or efficiency is in doubt; only then will it remain current, compliant and credible. Any challenges to the Constitution will be discussed democratically at an Annual General Meeting (or Special General Meeting for Trust Rules) and amendments incorporated as necessary.
